MEETING ABOUT LANDSIDE RUNOFF PROJECT SET FOR WEDNESDAY AT CITY PARK PAVILION

Kenner, LA. – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will hold a meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 16 to provide information and answer questions regarding the ongoing Landside Runoff Project in Kenner.

The meeting will be held at 6 p.m. at the Kenner City Park Pavilion, 3800 Loyola Drive.

Councilman Dominick Impastato said he talked to some residents who had questions and concerns about the project. “It seemed only logical to get residents together with officials from the Corps of Engineers, and I appreciate them agreeing to this meeting so quickly.”

The Landside Runoff Project is designed to retain rainfall and reduce the risk of flooding. The work includes installing sections of vinyl sheet pile wall near the existing drain inlets and also raising earthen berms.

Work has been completed south of West Esplanade Avenue and the contractor is expected to focus on the East Jefferson Levee District right of way behind properties north of Vintage Drive, including St. James Drive, St. Paul Drive and Zion Street.

Kenner residents living north of Vintage have been notified of the meeting through door hangers, but all residents are welcome to attend to learn more about the project and ask questions.
