KENNER OFFICIALS RECOMMEND TRICK-OR-TREATING TAKE PLACE ON FRIDAY

CHANCE OF RAIN, SEVERE WEATHER ON HALLOWEEN, SATURDAY OCT. 31

Kenner, LA. – Kenner Mayor Michael Yenni and Police Chief Mike Glaser are asking that all outdoor trick-or-treating activities be moved up one day to Friday, Oct. 30, because of the forecast for potentially stormy weather on Saturday.

Jefferson Parish officials have made the same request in unincorporated areas of the parish. The weather forecast calls for heavy rain and thunderstorms with the possibility of severe weather on Saturday – particularly in the afternoon and evening.

“This is a matter of safety – we don’t want any of our youngsters out in dangerous weather that reduces visibility and affects motorists as well,” Yenni said.
