NEW KENNER COUNCIL HOLDS FIRST MEETING; WILL ELECT OFFICERS

Kenner, LA. - Tonight's Kenner City Council meeting, which marks the start of Mayor Michael Yenni's second term in office, is the first for four new council members and includes only two council members returning to the seats they represented for the past four years.

However, two of the new council members – Keith Conley in the District B at-large seat and Mike Sigur in the District 2 seat – have years of experience in Kenner government. Conley is the former City Attorney while Sigur has three decades of experience in the Kenner Police Department.

Lawyers Lenny Cline of District 4 and Dominick Impastato of District 5 round out the new faces on the council. Tonight's meeting also features new Police Chief Michael Glaser, a police veteran and former Deputy Chief, who follows his former boss, Steve Caraway.

"I can't tell you how excited I am to work with this new council to build upon some of the accomplishments in the city during the past four years," Yenni said. "This group has a great mix of youth and experience. I look forward to helping them make their dreams for the city become reality."

Returning council members include Gregory Carroll of District 1 and Keith Reynaud of District 3. Maria DeFrancesch, former District 4 council member, takes over the District A at-large seat.

One of the first items on the agenda for the new council is to choose a president and vice-president. The president runs the meetings and fills in for the mayor, if he is not present. The vice-president fills in for the president.
