GROUNDBREAKING FOR KENNER RECYCLING CENTER SET FOR NOV. 14

Kenner, LA. – Mayor Ben Zahn, Police Chief Michael Glaser and members of the City Council are holding a groundbreaking on Nov. 14 at 10 a.m. for the first Kenner Recycling Station.

The groundbreaking will be located at 24th Street and Connecticut Avenue. The new center will take in woody waste, recyclables and building demo materials. However, no garbage, batteries or toxic materials will be allowed.

The center, with an estimated cost of about \$1 million, is expected to take five months to build - and construction work could begin as soon as July of 2019, barring any unexpected delays. Construction costs will be paid for through the 2030 Program. The center will then pay for itself by reducing costs at the landfill.

The groundbreaking also will include a special presentation by Mayor Zahn and Bob Ramelli of Ramelli Waste.
