KENNER UNDER FREEZE WARNING AND WIND ADVISORY

Kenner, LA. – For the second time in less than a week, Kenner is under a freeze warning with overnight temperatures expected as low as the upper 20s, according to the National Weather Service.

In addition, the entire area is also under a wind advisory with winds of 26 to 39 mph expected during much of the day. Forecasters warn that “strong winds will make driving conditions difficult for high profile vehicles ... small objects may be blown around if not tied down.”

If Kenner does experience freezing temperatures overnight, it won't last more than 1 to 3 hours, according to the weather service. That poses no danger to pipes, but pets and vegetation should be protected.

The highs today and Tuesday are expected near 50 degrees with lows Monday night in the mid-30s. However, a warming trend is expected to send high temperatures near 70 degrees by Friday.
