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CAMPAIGN SIGNS NOT ALLOWED ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY UNTIL AUG. 25

Kenner, LA. – A reminder to candidates in any of the elections on the Oct. 24 ballot – campaign signs are not allowed on residential property in Kenner until Aug. 25 – 60 days before the election.

“We have had a few signs that we have picked up and we just want to make sure everyone understands the law and the deadline,” said Code Enforcement Director Aimee Vallot.

According to Sec. 6.02(14)(g) of the city’s comprehensive Zoning Ordinance:

“A temporary, non-illuminated sign, limited to thirty-two (32) square feet in area, indicating the support of the owner or occupant for candidates running for election to local, state, or national governmental positions providing said election pertains to the respective political jurisdiction within which the property is located and provided further that any such sign shall not be erected more than sixty (60) days prior to the election and that such sign shall be removed within ten (10) days following said election.”

Kenner has no similar sign regulations covering commercial properties.

Vallot said some candidates and their supporters may become confused because there is no similar prohibition in unincorporated Jefferson Parish.

After qualifying in early September, Vallot said her office will send out certified letters to all candidates who will be on the ballot in the city spelling out the sign regulations. That includes state races such as lieutenant governor and governor as well as parish and city races.
