THIS SUMMER'S BUCKLED STREETS ARE GETTING COSTLY

Unusually hot weather this summer is taking a toll on the cost of repairing Kenner streets that buckle in the intense heat that has hovered around 100 or more degrees on some afternoons the last three months.

Jerry Dillenkoffer, director of streets and drainage, said his department has responded to 23 events since May 5 where streets have buckled and total repairs have added up to \$338,253.

His figures showed the two most costly repairs were June 14 at 3700 Loyola Drive, \$23,298, and on June 17 at 4216 W. Loyola Drive, \$23,188.

The latest heat buckle was on July 15 at 2407 25th Street and was repaired as a cost of \$22,094.60. The least expensive buckle to repair so far was on May 25 at 3419 Florida Avenue at a cost of \$3,399.
