KENNER PERSONNEL REMAIN ON DUTY THROUGH RAIN EVENT

Debris Cleanup Continues at City Drainage Catch Basin

Kenner officials have kept public works personnel on duty into the night Monday in order to respond to heavy rains anticipated in the area.

City crews spent much of the day Monday unclogging debris from drainage catch basins in areas where streets flooded over the past weekend. Officials continued their pleas that citizens assist in keeping street drains free from debris.

Mayor Ed Muniz asked citizens to clean debris from catch basins and drain grates to allow rainwater easy flow to the drainage system. Several locations flooded over the weekend as some spots received four inches of rain during brief periods.

Heavy rains can also affect the city sewerage system and possibly result in sewage backups. If that occurs or if it is close to happening, please call Veolia Water NA, the city's private sewerage system contractor. Veolia's phone number is 468-7292.

If you observe a debris strewn location that is too large for a person to handle, please call it in to the Kenner Public Works Department at 468-7515.

The National Weather Service said most flood deaths occur in automobiles. Never drive your vehicle into areas where the water covers the roadway. Flood waters are usually deeper than they appear.

Just one foot of flowing water is powerful enough to sweep vehicles off the road, the NWS cautioned. When encountering flooded roads, make the smart choice ... turn around... don't drown.
