CITY OF KENNER IN FULL RECOVERY MODE AFTER HURRICANE FRANCINE; EMERGENCY RESPONSE, CLEANUP AND DAMAGE ASSESSMENTS ONGOING; CURBSIDE GARBAGE COLLECTION SUSPENDED TODAY

Kenner, LA. – (SEPTEMBER 12, 2024) Impacts from Hurricane Francine are widespread throughout the City of Kenner. Recovery response continues and recovery actions are underway.

City Actions and Updates:

- Curbside garbage collection is cancelled for today due to landfill closure.
- Residents are asked to continue to conserve water usage due to power outages and overload on Kenner's sewer system.
- Traffic signals remain without power throughout Kenner; motorists are asked to proceed with extreme caution
- Because all Kenner essential personnel are assisting with storm response efforts, Government Offices remain closed Thursday, September 12th. This includes the Mable Trepagnier Brown Kenner Senior Center, as well as the Hispanic Resource Center, the Kenner Food Bank and the Martin Luther King Center. Mayor's Court is cancelled.
- Kenner's Emergency Operation Center remains activated today. The phone number for non-emergency assistance is 504-468-4357. Reminder, call 911 for emergencies.
- Do not drive on flooded streets. Kenner City Ordinance 7-66 prohibits motorists from traveling on flooded streets in such a manner to cause water, waves or wakes to enter property alongside of or adjacent to the road, or cause water to rise in already flooded property. Motorists are asked to exercise extreme caution on all roadways.



- All Kenner Parks and Recreation programming, both indoor and outdoor, remains cancelled through Friday, September 13th.
- The Market at Kenner City Park is cancelled for Thursday, September 12th.
- The Kenner Boat Launch at Laketown remains closed until further notice.
- The North Kenner Library remains closed today.
